An Urban Oasis

Our campuses are more than just a place of education, they are a sanctuary where students can thrive, explore, and forge lifelong friendships. With every moment spent within its embrace, our students embark on a journey of growth, guided by the gentle hand of care and the boundless spirit of adventure.

Nestled in the historic suburb of Hyde Park – just 3km from the Adelaide central business district – Walford encompasses two campuses, as well as a sports field and boat shed.

The Junior School

Amidst gentle greenery, our Junior School campus welcomes students from the early learning years to Year 6. As children step onto the grounds, they are embraced by an atmosphere of care and encouragement. Every corner exudes a comforting familiarity, fostering a sense of belonging and security.

Within this haven of learning, whimsical play spaces await, inviting young hearts and minds to embark on thrilling adventures of imagination. From enchanted play spaces to cozy reading nooks adorned with vibrant colours and soft cushions, each area sparks creativity and joy. Playful structures and winding paths can be found amongst the picturesque environment, encouraging exploration and fostering a love for discovery.

The vibrant campus also features facilities that are utilised by the entire School community, including a state-of-the-art sports centre with two indoor courts, movement studio, high performance gym and swimming pool.



The Secondary School

Across the road, the Secondary School campus is home to our Year 7 to 12 students. Featuring a central space, known as the Heart of Walford, girls regularly gather for outside study, reflection, and catching up with friends. Gardens, lawns, open spaces and quiet corners underpin Walford's reputation as a warm, welcoming school that cherishes spaces designed for peaceful contemplation, meaningful collaboration, and intentional play.

Walford's buildings recognise and honour the School's bold pioneering women – many of whom were also trailblazers in the wider community and indeed the world. Amongst them, Headmistresses Mabel Jewell Baker, Nina Morrison and Ellen Benham, the first female academic at Adelaide University. The Ellen Benham Science Centre is a dynamic STEM learning environment consisting of five laboratories. The light, bright and modern flexible design encourages innovation, critical thinking and collaboration. The state-of-the-art chemistry laboratory is fitted with moveable fume extractors, while VR goggles and drones all add to the valuable suite of learning tools available for students. These help to ensure that every girl who wishes to pursue STEM subjects and careers, can access world-class facilities to capture her interest and build her capabilities.

For girls who seek to harness their interest in design and innovation, Walford's Design and Technology Centre provides an inspiring setting that embraces the colonial-era features of the historic villa with industrial facilities and the latest technology. Juxtaposing the heritage character with state-of-the-art education, the Centre's learning resources include 3D printers, laser cutters, photographic equipment and a teaching kitchen. Discovering tomorrow in an historic setting reinforces the notion that, when carefully applied, tradition and innovation can walk hand-in-hand.

Helen Reid Hall plays host to an array of events and showcases of student talent and voice. With its auditorium and downstairs green room, it serves as a performing arts hub for musicals, drama performances and concerts, and it is here that the entire School can assemble for special occasions such as special awards ceremonies and liturgical services.

Beyond the campuses, the Parks Playing Field and Pavilion is a modern facility for sport, as well as special events, while the boat shed at West Lakes provides an ideal home for the School's internationally renowned rowing program.

Boarding at Walford

Choosing Walford means choosing more than just a school; it means choosing a nurturing community where your daughter can grow, thrive, and find her place in the world.

For over 100 years, boarders have enriched our School community with their diverse backgrounds and experiences. Whether they hail from regional South Australia or across the globe, our girls forge friendships that transcend borders and cultures. They bring with them a tapestry of traditions and perspectives that enrich the fabric of our community.

Nestled within the Secondary School campus, our Boarding House stands as a beacon of comfort and belonging, providing a supportive environment where girls flourish academically and personally. Setting the benchmark in modern boarding facilities, the rooms within the eight apartments are grouped around a central common room and kitchenette, creating a familiar, warm ambience where girls can relax together and feel genuinely at home. Younger girls entering the House for the first time commonly share a twin room, which includes its own ensuite bathroom, while senior girls have the opportunity for a single suite with a study area and private bathroom.

Our Boarding House radiates with positivity and productivity. Younger students receive supervised homework sessions while older ones learn the value of independent study. Our dedicated staff maintain open lines of communication with teachers to promptly address any academic concerns, ensuring every girl receives the support she needs to thrive. Parents stay involved in their daughter's journey through regular updates via phone calls, emails, social media, and online meetings.

To honour our boarders' contribution to our community, we host opportunities for our students to proudly share their heritage and traditions through assemblies and engaging activities. The girls enjoy an exciting and fulfilling weekend activities program, which caters to a wide range of interests. These additional opportunities ensure girls enjoy new experiences, socialise and strengthen bonds with their boarding 'sisters', and make the most of all Adelaide has to offer. From impromptu movie nights to special dinners at the Fig Tree Café, the bonds forged amongst Boarding 'sisters' that last a lifetime.

EMPOWERING GIRLS: Holistic Development and Wellbeing

Pastoral Support

Each student is at the centre of all we think, say and do at Walford. They are known, recognised and celebrated for who they truly are.

Guided by a team of caring adults in teaching and pastoral roles, your daughter is supported to grow in self-awareness, confidence and capability. This includes leadership opportunities, such as Boarding House Captains, tour guides and International Student Ambassadors, as well as access to a counsellor and bilingual support.

In the Junior School, your daughter will be supported by her classroom teacher, who has oversight of her wellbeing and care. In addition, the Head of Junior School and supportive staff are involved in all aspects of each girl's wellbeing.

In the Secondary School, girls are connected with a mentor, who will be her key pastoral carer. They will work with your daughter to support her wellbeing and development and help tailor a unique pathway that will lead her to pursue her aspirations and achieve her ambitions.

From developing organisation skills, navigating challenges, setting goals, actioning strategies, and building the credentials needed to create a unique profile, both inside and outside the school, your daughter's mentor will work to help her achieve her best, her way.

House Spirit

At Walford, your daughter will become part of a vibrant House community, each named after distinguished members of the Walford community. These Houses serve as the heartbeat of our School, offering weekly gatherings to foster friendships across year levels, plan exciting events like the Athletics Carnival and House Glee, and instil a strong sense of belonging.

Camps and Tours

Walford girls are explorers, adventurers, enquirers and leaders.

Underpinning this are the opportunities our students receive to extend their school experience well beyond the classroom. From as young as Year 2, we begin the overnight experience in the Zoo Snooze program. This initial camp is a wonderful way to begin our overnight opportunities, which is then built upon for Years 3 and 4 by increasing to an additional night away on camp.

Students in Years 5 to 9 venture out on camps that are designed to encompass regional, historical, and outdoor education experiences. They allow students the opportunity to build life skills, rise to challenges, and consolidate friendships.

Walford's Outdoor Education program is also part of school life for all girls in Years 5 to 9. It provides a rich pathway to connect with nature, develop greater autonomy, work collaboratively with peers, build enduring friendships, and stretch each student's ability to become a robust, courageous, well-rounded young women.

To prepare our girls for their roles as global citizens, students seize upon opportunities for interstate and international learning and travel, such as our Year 6 Canberra trip, Walford-run language immersion trips to France, Chinese language tours, skiing interstate and in Japan, and our unique NASA-inspired STEM and Space Tour in the USA. Additionally, students are encouraged to tailor their own experiences, with individual opportunities such as the Oxford Royale Academy Summer School.
