You will study an extended prose text (e.g. a novel, memoir or selected short stories), film, poetry, drama and non-fiction texts that may be chosen from the contemporary world, from the past, and from Australian and other cultures. You will explore how the purpose of a text is achieved and how stylistic choices position the audience to respond to ideas and perspectives in a text.
