A miscarriage of justice arises when an innocent person is found guilty of an offence and is wrongly convicted, leading to wrongful imprisonment. The criminal justice system in Australia is designed to protect against this through upholding the presumption of innocence by ensuring those sentenced to imprisonment have first been found guilty beyond a reasonable doubt. However, miscarriages of justice do occur at great expense to individuals and the broader community.
