



Just 28 students in South Australia received a Governor of South Australia Commendation Award and Walford is very proud that Mackenzie Francis-Brown is among them.

The award is a combination of academic excellence and the difference they have made to their communities. Mackenzie has been an outstanding role model throughout her schooling at Walford from 2005 to 2019. She fundraised annually for Cancer Council SA, raising over \$12,000 through its Biggest Morning Tea program and was made a Cancer Council Youth Ambassador.

Best Teacher in Australia

Walford Mathematics teacher, Deb Woodard-Knight, was distinguished in 2019 with the award for Best Secondary Mathematics Teacher in Australia, presented by the Australian Mathematical Science Institute.

At a ceremony in Melbourne, Deb was presented with the Award which recognises "an exemplary and innovative teacher who has been instrumental in encouraging students to continue with their study of Mathematics."

Deb is now in her third year of teaching predominantly girls in Year 11 and 12, in both SACE and IB courses, at Walford. Deb is absolutely passionate about encouraging girls to continue to pursue Specialist Mathematics at school and beyond to university. She inspires her students and shows them how Mathematics is related to the real world and to future careers in STEM.

In addition to teaching at senior Mathematics level, Deb has also been instrumental in introducing MathsCraft to Years 5 and 6 at Walford. Deb's philosophy is that "the development of problem-solving strategies at an early age sets up students for success in Mathematics and in life generally, building students resilience and risk taking ability."

Deb lives and breathes Mathematics 24/7, such is her genuine love of her subject. In her own special way she adds humour in her explanations and she enjoys wearing maths inspired t-shirts, shoes, socks and brooches, much to the fascination of her students.

Deb scooped the pool at the Awards as she was set apart with another honour, The Excellence in Teaching Award, for "a teacher who is an engaging and passionate communicator of Mathematics and who inspires students to see the beauty and importance of Mathematics."

The students, staff and Deb's colleagues are very proud of the well-deserved recognition that Deb has received on the national stage.



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
